In Kansas almost \$67 million dollars have been put towards implementing PSP projects. But those are not limited to federal funds and their associated match for implementation. As of April 2020, ten plans have put a combination of local and other funds towards implementation without the use of suballocated funds. This represents over \$35 million dollars – \$28 million local and \$7 million other – of implementation that turns local vision into reality for more vibrant communities..

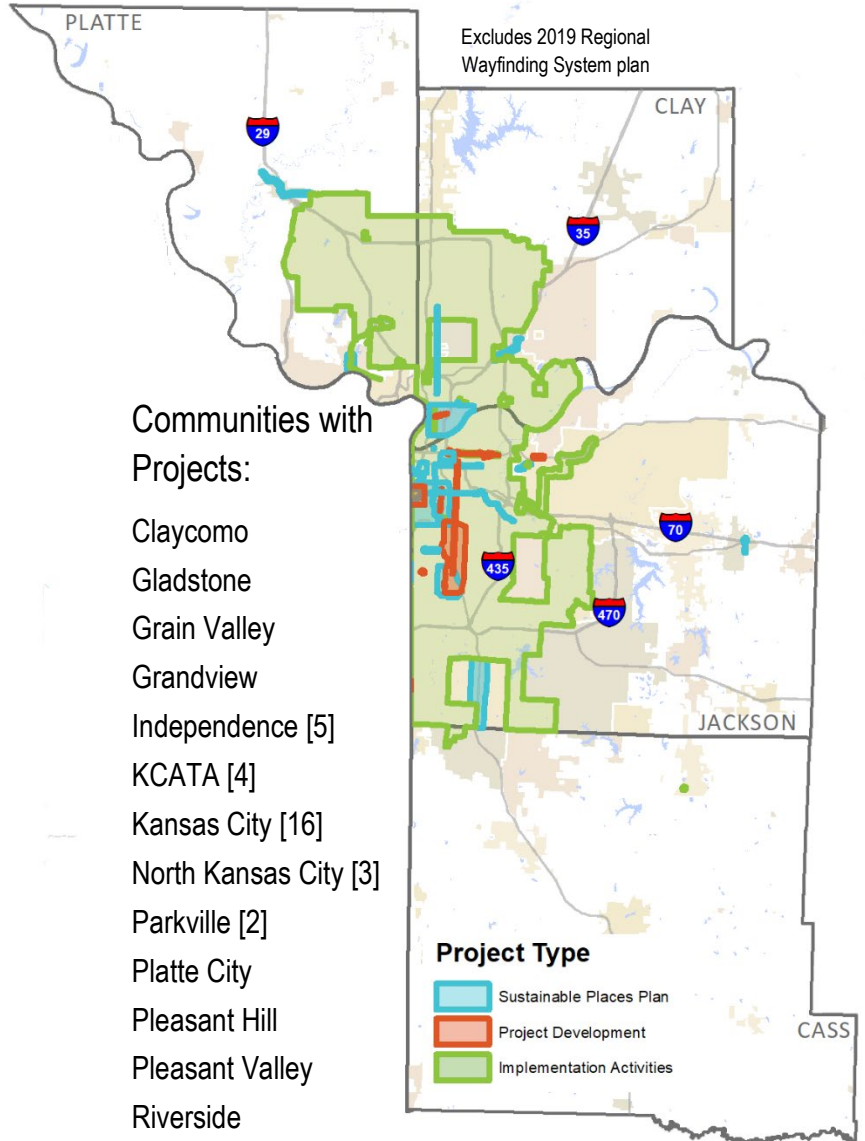
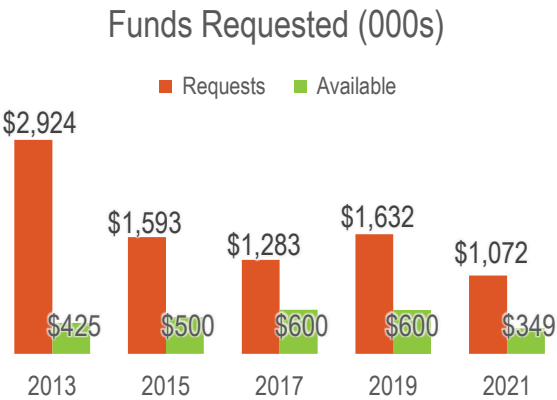
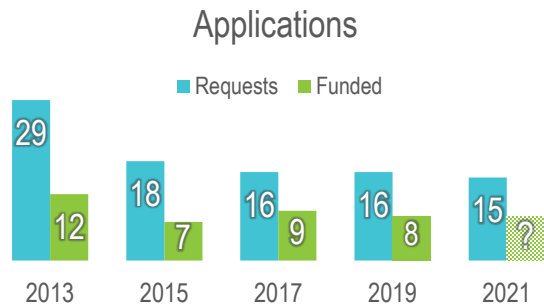

In Missouri almost \$107 million dollars have been put towards implementing PSP projects. But implementation isn't limited to federal funds and their associated match. As of April 2020, ten plans have put a combination of local and other funds towards implementation without the use of suballocated funds. This represents over \$43 million dollars – \$33 million local and \$11 million other – of implementation that turns local vision into reality for more vibrant communities..
