This is a MoDOT intersection. We cannot place signs at that intersection. Also placing signs at intersections where a sight impaired person may cross is not practicable..

304.080. Pedestrians, Disabled Persons With Cane Or Dog--drivers, Precautions, Liability The driver of a vehicle approaching a person with a visual, aural or physical disability who is carrying a cane predominantly white or metallic in color, with or without a red tip, or using a guide dog, hearing dog or service dog shall yield to such pedestrian, and any driver who fails to take such precautions shall be liable in damages for any injury caused such pedestrian and any injury caused to the pedestrian's guide dog, hearing dog or service dog; provided that such a pedestrian not carrying such cane or using a guide dog, hearing dog or service dog in any of the places, accommodations or conveyances listed in section 209.150, RSMo, shall have a rights and privileges conferred by law upon other persons.

However the path this person travels has hazardous. which need to be addressed some are on MoDOT property. such as water standing on the sidewalk due to poor drainage, and trees overhanging the sidewalk.

Conditions the city needs to address is the sidewalk torn up due to an active water break, and trees overhanging their sidewalk on Independence Street. We also need a few more ADA truncated dome warning along S. Independence.

I will contact MoDot about the standing water, contact codes about the trees overhanging the sidewalk,, the Water Department will repair the water break and sidewalk at Main Street and finally I will pursue the remaining ADA ramps on South Independence.

I spoke to Tim Clowdesky 435-421-9987 whom Jamie is referring and told him that MoDOT owns the sidewalk from South Street to Commercial Street and that I would work to improve the cities sidewalk. He said that he would take a picture of the signage he was referring too.
